There has been so much happening that I thought I would use my space in this month's Encourager to simply make sure we are all up to speed on a few things. So, here's what I want to make sure you know;

First, praise be to God for the new faces, the new members, and the regular filling of our baptistry waters lately. God is certainly on the move at RRBC and almost weekly we are reminded that He is still in the business of changing lives and building the Kingdom one soul at a time. With all the new faces though, it presents both the challenge of not always knowing everyone and the opportunity to make visitors feel welcome and to integrate new members into our family. Third, we have said goodbye to our pianist Amy Gideon and hello to our old friend and new pianist Elena Doomy. I hate that our relationship with Amy had to come to an end, but God has blessed us tremendously with the addition of Elena to our staff. She and her family will be a great asset to our church and I encourage you to welcome them properly!

Finally, we've been working diligently to prepare the budget for 2026 and will have copies available on Sunday, Nov. 9 for anyone who would like to study it before we vote on Wednesday evening, Nov. 19. The

bottom line is that we are submitting a proposal for a total budget of \$378,197.62 which is about an 8.2% increase over 2025. That sounds like a big step, but I would remind you that giving for 2025 has already surpassed that number with two months left in the year, so it is a very doable, manageable budget.

See, I told you we've been busy! Now you're in the know, but most importantly I always want you to be in the know about how much God loves you! It's a great privilege to be your friend and pastor.

This is the season of the year, as Thanksgiving approaches, when we offer gratitude to the Lord for the blessings. He has bestowed on all of us. I'm reminded of this with the decorations seen in many places including our home. Kay has them placed in several locations and they really add to the "feel of home" where we live. (Somehow they seem to multiply as each year passes!)

Among these decorations is the Horn of Plenty which displays the fruit of a bountiful harvest. As I read from a daily devotional book, "Moments with God" by Dr. David Jeremiah, he mentioned how God has blessed us with harvest for each season. In winter, we enjoy the citrus fruits. We all look forward to strawberries in late spring. As we transition into summer, we enjoy blueberries, blackberries, raspberries, grapes, tomatoes, cucumbers, and a large variety of produce from the garden. Fall brings apples, pumpkins, and pecans among other things.

Dr. Jeremiah continues with a challenge based on Galatians 5:22
-23 and the fruit of the Spirit. As God's children, we need to seek to be well grounded, or rooted solid, in Jesus, as the branches are in the Vinc. This allows the "sap" or power of the Holy Spirit, to flow freely and nourish us with the word of God (Col. 3:16) to produce these nine fruits, like grapes in a cluster. It's God's purpose that we bear this fruit continually, season to season, through every year of our lives.

So we each could ask ourselves, compared to a year ago, am I more loving? More joyful? Resting more in God's peace? How about more patient and kind? These fruits only exist as they are nurtured on a daily basis. As I read this challenge from God's word by Dr. Jeremiah, I was reminded of how it is underscored in verse 2 of the traditional Thanksgiving hymn "Come Ye Thankful People, Come": We ourselves are God's own field, fruit unto His praise to yield, wheat and tares together sown. Unto joy or sorrow grown, First the blade, and then the ear, then the full corn shall appear, Lord of harvest, grant that we, wholesome grain and pure may be."

So how good are the grapes hanging on our branches?

Children receive a snack, sing songs, and hear a Bible message, as they learn to participate in worship.


Children's Hand Bell Choir
